There are also plenty of outdoor lands and recreational areas for skiing, hiking, biking, and more.

Local tip:

Stop by Green Jeans Food Hall for a collection of local restaurants and shops housed in a series of shipping containers. From craft brews to Mexican-inspired barbeque, you'll find a little something for everyone.

LAS CRUCES


Las Cruces, located on the southern edge of the New Mexico border, offers all the amenities of a major urban area without the constriction. The 100,000-person metro is home to New Mexico State University, 22 parks and trails, and the intersection of two major interstates for easy access both into and out of the city. Residents also enjoy the nearby natural splendor of White Sands National Park, which is 275 square miles of desert featuring breathtaking dunes of soft, white gypsum sand.

Local tip:

Take a short trip south to Mesilla, where the infamous Billy the Kid stood trial. Today, locals and visitors alike enjoy authentic Mexican food, handcrafted artisan goods, and a walking tour of the purportedly haunted downtown district.

The median home value in Las Cruces is \$190,590, which is a 5.5% increase from the previous year. Zillow predicts this figure will rise another 8.0% within the next year.







SANTA FE

At nearly 7,200 feet, Santa Fe is the nation's highest state capital. The mountainous terrain makes for ideal outdoor exploration, and the city itself is regarded as a hub of art and tourism. From bustling Downtown Santa Fe to the charming former farming district of Guadalupe, the city's diverse neighborhoods perfectly reflect the area's natural charm and artistic flare.

Local tip:

The Loretto Chapel is a must-see for history buffs and Instagram enthusiasts alike. In the late 1900s, a mysterious carpenter constructed the chapel's intricate spiral staircase, a structure with two 360-degree turns and no center pole for support. The staircase remains a feat of engineering revered around the world and a perfectly Instagram-able one at that.

The median home value in Santa Fe is \$420,526, which is a 3.9% increase from the previous year. Zillow predicts this figure will rise another 7.2% within the next year

ROSWELL

Lovers of the strange and unexplained will feel right at home in Roswell, home of the International UFO Museum & Research Center. The town is a hot spot for tourism, drawing in thousands of visitors, researchers, and lecturers each year. Along with the regular influx of extraterrestrial-seeking tourists, Roswell's ~50,000 residents enjoy diverse, quiet neighborhoods, Southwest-inspired art and culture, and plenty of nearby natural beauty.

Stop by the Bitter Lake National Wildlife Refuge for breathtaking views enveloping the local flora and fauna. Kids and adults alike will enjoy spotting everything from owls to coyotes or, perhaps, a UFO overhead

TAOS
