The Summerlin and Peccole Ranch neighborhoods have been rated some of the best in Las Vegas for raising children away from all the neon lights. If you're looking to escape the strip, take a 20-minute drive to a whole new world. Red Rock Canyon is a nearby National Conservation Area perfect for hiking, biking, and climbing. Stop by the visitor's center for an array of exhibits, information on local flora and fauna, and even live desert tortoise habitats.

RENO

Often considered a mini Las Vegas, Reno has all the casinos without the crowds. Nestled just east of the Sierra Nevadas, the city is also a stone's throw from picturesque Lake Tahoe, a hub for swimming, boating, and fishing, and hosts the country's highest concentration of first-rate ski resorts. With a burgeoning economy and year-round recreation, Reno is an ideal destination for Nevadans and transplants alike.

For an activity that perfectly marries Reno's world-class recreation and neon casino industry, you can rock climb above the iconic, fluorescent Reno arch. "The Big Wall," the world's largest outdoor climbing wall, is located outside Reno's Basecamp Climbing Gym. Scale the wall after dark, illuminated by the sign's red and blue glow.

BOULDER CITY

Boulder City, a charming, quiet community in southern Nevada, is home to the historic Hoover Dam and a slower pace of living. The average income of a Boulder City resident is nearly 10% higher than the national average, and the city's crime rate is 67% lower than the national average. Between the city's ban on gambling and its quaint, small-town appeal, Boulder City is a popular location for retirees and growing families.

Nearby Lake Mead offers activities for outdoor enthusiasts, history buffs, and artists alike. Schedule a scuba diving excursion, explore the Historic Railroad Trail, or photograph the region's diverse and abundant flora and fauna.

The median home value in Boulder City is \$334,509, which is a 7.1% increase from the previous year. Zillow predicts this figure will rise another 7.7% within the next year.

CARSON CITY

Carson City, named after famed frontiersman Kit Carson, is the state capital and considered the heart of Nevada's history. The metro sits in the northwestern portion of the state, just 20 minutes south of Reno. It shares the same amenities Lake Tahoe provides with smaller neighborhoods and a thriving historic district. Homeseekers are sure to love the many Queen Anne, Gothic Revival, and Victorian-style homes that characterize the Carson City community.

Local tip: The Kit Carson trail weaves through some of the town's most notable historic neighborhoods. A blue line painted on streets and sidewalks leads past landmarks like Mark Twain's brother's house, where the author stayed in the 1860s, the childhood home of Ferris Wheel inventor George Ferris, and even a filming location of John Wayne's The Shootist.

The median home value in Carson City is \$346,850, which is a 5.3% increase from the previous year. Zillow predicts this figure will rise another 6.0% within the next year.


PAHRUMP

The town of Pahrump sits on the Nevada-California border, about an hour east of Death Valley National Park, one of the hottest and driest regions in the world. Embracing all the area has to offer, locals enjoy highspeed racing, off-roading in the nearby Dumont Dunes, and, believe it or not, water jetpacking.
