ILLINOIS MANAGING BROKER REAL ESTATE LICENSE

Getting an upgraded license might seem a bit daunting, but we're here to guide you through the process.

Read on to learn the four steps you'll need to take before upgrading your license in Illinois.



Prerequisites

To start, you must already be a licensed real estate broker in Illinois and have maintained your broker status by completing 30 hours of Post-Licensing.

Complete 45 hours of approved managing broker Pre-Licensing education.

Successfully complete an approved 45 clock hour Pre-Licensing course with 30 hours of managing broker Pre-Licensing education and 15 mandatory interactive hours.

Pass the course final exam.

After you complete all the course materials, meet the minimum time requirement, and pass the practice exam, you must pass a course final exam. The minimum passing score is 75%.

Pass the Illinois Real Estate Broker Examination.

PSI administers the Illinois Real Estate Managing Broker licensing exam. This test is comprised of two portions, covering both state and national requirements. For more information, see the PSI candidate exam information here.
