#4: Tulsa metro



#?: STILLWATER

Stillwater, like Norman, is a college town where everyone can find something to love. Not only is Stillwater home to Oklahoma State University, but it has also earned critical acclaim for the quality of life it affords to residents. In 2015, Money Magazine named Stillwater as one of the top 25 places to retire in the United States. Later, Southern Living ranked Stillwater sixth on its "The South's Friendliest Cities 2018" list, and it also ranks as one of the happiest small towns in America according to Top Counseling Schools.

Are you thirsting for beer knowledge? Head on down to the <u>Iron Monk Brewery</u> where you can enjoy both a brewery tour that concludes in their premier tap room and a nice, locally-sourced brew.
