

This town has lots to offer families through a great school system, miles of trail systems, golf courses, water activities, and of course during the NFL season, Green Bay Packer football. Located just 5 miles from Lambeau Field, living in De Pere places you right near the action. During the off-season, the stadium is open for tours, including their Green Bay Packer Hall of Fame.

#3: BROOKFIELD


The median home price in Middleton is \$380,158, which is a 6.4% increase from last year. Zillow predicts this will rise another 4.6% within the next year.
